IT IS CERTIFIED, That the records of this office show that — John Marrow — was enlisted as a Private in Company H, Thirty sixth Regiment Iowa Vol. Infantry, on the Fifth day of August 1862, at Ottumwa Iowa, by Capt. John E. Wright and was mustered into the United States service as such for the period of Three years, on Twentyseventh day of August 1862, at Keokuk, by Lt. Chas. J. Ball U. S. A. Mustering Officer, and that the said John Marrow was taken prisoner at Mark's Mills Ark. April 25th 1864 and exchanged Feb'y 25th 1865.
 Promoted to 8th Corporal April 10th 1865, 7th Corp. July 19th 1865.
 Mustered out at Duval's Bluff Ark August 24th 1865.
